TEXTUAL DESCRIPTION

Baltic bottoms in the photic zone with at least 90 % coverage of rock, boulders or stones of more than 63 mm in diameter. Epibenthic cnidarians cover at least 10%, and more than other perennial attached erect groups. Out of the attached epibenthic cnidariand hydroids represent at least 50 % of the biomass.

PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

Substrate is rock and/or boulders.
