AA.H3M5 BALTIC PHOTIC MUDDY SEDIMENT DOMINATED BY VARIOUS OPPORTUNISTIC POLYCHAETES

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TEXTUAL DESCRIPTION

Baltic photic zone bottoms with at least 90 % coverage of muddy sediment. The sediment must contain at least 20 % of mud, silt or clay (grain size less than 63 μ m). Biomass of infaunal polychaetes dominates and is highest in the group that includes infaunal bivalves/polychaetes/crustaceans/echinoderms/insect larvae. Out of the infaunal polychaetes various opportunistic polychaetes constitute at least 50 % of the biomass.

PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

Substrate is muddy sediment. Appears in low to moderate energy exposure classes.

Polydora ciliata, Lagis koreni, Capitella capitata, Scoloplos (Scoloplos) armiger
