AA.I1B BALTIC PHOTIC COARSE SEDIMENT CHARACTERIZED BY SUBMERGED ROOTED PLANTS

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TEXTUAL DESCRIPTION

Baltic bottoms in the photic zone with at least 90 % coverage of coarse sediment. Coarse sediment has less than 20 % of mud/silt/clay fraction (<63 μ m), and the proportion of gravel and pebbles (grain size 2–63 mm) exceeds 30% of the combined gravel and sand fraction. Submerged rooted plants, including plants with rhizoids (i.e. Charales) cover at least 10 % of the seabed and more than other perennial attached erect groups.

Salinity range: all; Exposure range: moderate; Depth range: photic zone

Stuckenia pectinata, Zannichellia spp., Zostera marina, Charales

Decreased light penetration depth and increased sedimentation caused by eutrophication
